1. Our decision to follow has to take facts into account.
2. God offers us choices
3. Do you see a spiritual choice at this time?

*“Then Jesus said to his disciples, “If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.*

*Matthew 16:24*

1. We are to deny ourselves
2. We are to follow Jesus. To take up your cross is to take up a burden of service for others
3. This sounds hard—what makes it easier?

*“Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable--if anything is excellent or praiseworthy--think*

about such things.”

*Philippians 4:8*

1. The ultimate choice is to seek good for ourselves
2. Does this extend to all aspects of our life?

*“Your beauty should not come from outward adornment, such as braided hair and the wearing of gold jewelry and fine clothes. Instead, it should be that of your inner self, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God’s sight”*

*1 Peter 3:3,4*

1. The focus in our lifestyle is in having a strong inner life
2. There is less stress on our looks—because it is how God looks on us that matters
3. We should have beauty
4. Does this stress on honouring God extend to how we use our possessions?

*“Will a man rob God? Yet you rob me. But you ask, ‘How do we rob you?’ ‘In tithes and offerings.’”*

*Malachi 3:8*

1. Good men in the days before Jesus robbed

God and did not know it.

2. God defines how they robbed Him.
3. There is an obligation to give both tithes and offerings

*“Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You give a tenth of your spices--mint, dill and cummin. But you have neglected the more important matters of the law--justice, mercy and faithfulness. You should have practiced the latter, without neglecting the former.”*

*Matthew 23:23*

1. Jesus approved of giving tithe
2. Tithing has to be combined with right relationships
3. We have seen that Jesus cares for His people—will He care for our day to day living as well? Does the following text answer the question?

*“So do not worry, saying, ‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’ For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.”*

*Matthew 6:33*
